

Covid-19 Update - March 2021



As we begin to see a brighter future with the developments and progress in the battle with Covid-19, and the governments hopeful road map out of the lock-down, we can start to look forward to once again using our boats and enjoying the waterways once again. With that in mind, we thought we would update you to the calender to help you to plan your return to using your boat and getting out and about.

Monday 29th March 2021

- The stay at home restriction is lifted. People can return to their boats for day use only, only if they are local.
- No overnight stays allowed.
- Boating with up to 6 people from two households allowed, as long as social distancing rules can be followed, and only on the outside deck space.
- The marina gate will continue to be closed during the day.

Monday 12th April 2021

Overnight stays are allowed away from home (single household bubbles only)

- Normal boating can resume and the Avon Navigation will be open for normal use from this date.
- The marina gate will revert to being open during normal business hours.
- Visitor mooring locations on the River Avon will revert back to the 48 hour stay restriction.
- The marina toilet and shower facility will open for use.





Please bear in mind that the dates mentioned are provisional dates set by the government and are to be used as a guideline only. As we approach the dates mentioned, we will no doubt be updated by the government as to how things are progressing and whether, as a nation, we have reached the criteria for the next step to be taken. At least this is a guide that we can all keep in mind and hopefully get ready to enjoy the summer and look forward to getting back to boating, and some sort of normality, again.

I would just like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your support, understanding and compliance with the restrictions throughout this pandemic, and we look forward to brighter days ahead.
